Benefits of Napping

More and more people are missing out on the sleep they need to stay healthy. Whether due to work pressure or due to increased social connectedness, people are not falling asleep as early or as easily as in the past. One tip to overcome this lack of nighttime sleep is to take more naps during the day. Sleep researchers divide naps into three categories: planned, emergency, and habitual. A planned nap is for when you know you will have to stay awake and alert for a long time. An emergency nap is for when you suddenly feel too tired to function properly. And a habitual nap is one taken at about the same time every day. The National Sleep Foundation recommends taking short naps, from 20 to 30 minutes in length. In addition, it suggests creating a dark, warm, and quiet environment for napping. Finally, it advises people not to take naps too late in the day because doing so could negatively affect nighttime sleep.
